




Your Destination Awaits...

From that thematic base, explore the fallen empires of Hampi, Mughal India, and Portuguese Goa, and be dazzled by Art Deco Mumbai. Trace the subcontinent's sweeping historical narrative through seven UNESCO sites.

This tour spans ancient to contemporary, and encompasses the incredible cultural, historical, and architectural riches of this vast and diverse country.

Dr DeCaroli is Professor of South and Southeast Asian art history at George Mason University. He is a specialist in the early history of Buddhism and has conducted fieldwork in India, Sri Lanka, and Southeast Asia. His first book, Haunting the Buddha: Indian Popular Religions and the Formation of Buddhism was published by Oxford University Press 2004, and his second book, Image Problems: The Origin and Development of the Buddha's Image in Early South Asia, was published by the University of Washington in 2015. More recently, he co-curated the Encountering the Buddha: Art and Practice across Asia exhibition at the Sackler Gallery of the Smithsonian Institution. He is also the author of several articles and book chapters. He has been was awarded a Getty Research Institute Fellowship and is currently a Robert N.H. Ho Family Foundation Research Fellow.

Nashik

Trek up to a nearby temple located on a hillock and watch a brilliant sunset from there, or take a stroll around the table-grape vineyards surrounding the property.



Hampi

Water, greenery and boulders are distinctive elements at this small resort located 7kms from UNESCO Hampi's Vijayanagar era temple ruins. This eco resort is nestled amidst water eroded boulders on the banks of Tungabhadra River. Individually decorated cottages bring the natural rock and flowing water theme indoors for a harmonious experience. An ideal place to cool your heels after a long day exploring the ruins of Hampi.



Goa

A restored 1879 Portuguese mansion within the boutique and restaurant lined area of Fontainhas, Panjim. Fontainhas is a conservation zone with heritage listed homes and winding alleyways, livened by splashes of vibrant colour on the walls. The central location puts you in walking distance to the waterfront. The original old world elegance has been retained and mixed with a splash of new and modern amenities to create a luxurious home away from home.
